Points of Difference

- There is a cost associated with some (but not all) non-government schools. Additional funding can sometimes be available through scholarships or other funding bodies such as Centrecorp.
- Most non-government schools (with the exception of Steiner and Yipirinya) have an association with a particular Religion and/or Church.
- In terms of support services, you will find many of the same roles in non-government and government schools. Psychologists, Counsellors, Aboriginal Education Workers, Inclusion support officers etc can generally be found in both types of schools.
- As previously mentioned some student support services cross over from the government system.
