

Some high risk indicators

- Recent separation or plans to separate
- ➤ Victim predicts that offender could harm or kill her/children
- > History of violence to family member/s
- Level and frequency of violence has increased
- ➤ Offender has attempted to strangle victim
- ➤ Offender has threatened to kill/harm family members in recent incident, including verbalised plans
- Pregnancy
- ➤ Harm to pets

Key messages



- Domestic violence is prevalent, serious and preventable
- Enquire about Family Safety Framework Training
- For guidance on high risk cases, speak to your agency's FSF representative (if you have one), or the Women's Shelter, or Police
- A mandatory report to Police is separate and additional to an FSF referral
